Naval Station Everett (NSE) is one of four major U.S. Navy Installations in the Navy Region Northwest located around the waters of Puget Sound. NSE is a valuable naval asset, being one of two Navyowned deep water ports on the West Coast of the continental United States.

NSE supports national defense as a homeport to a variety of surface ships that include eight U.S. Navy destroyers: USS Momsen, USS Gridley, USS Sampson, USS Kidd, USS John Paul Jones, USS John S McCain, USS McCampbell and USS Barry. The deployable command staffs of Carrier Strike Group 11 and Destroyer Squadron 9 have offices on base. A U.S. Coast Guard buoy-tender and coastal patrol boat are stationed here. Occasionally, Military Sealift Command supply vessels have also used the Navy port.

Since establishment in 1994, the base has carried out its mission with strong community support. NSE provides a secure home base for ships at the pier, active duty and reserve sailors, and their families. The base and its tenant commands provide critical functions such as port and tug operations, ship maintenance, military training, base security, emergency response, environmental stewardship, and public works.
